



The GCU's 2024 Second Quarter Financial Report by our Chief Financial Officer, Tim Demetres is presented on page 4 for your review. We experienced continued asset growth as assets increased \$53 million totaling \$2.758 billion. Surplus declined by \$4.4 million primarily due to an asset valuation reserve adjustment of \$7.3 million as this required reserve provides capital for unexpected credit losses. A net income loss of \$1.2 million was also experienced due to the current high in-

terest rate environment as GCU increased annuity crediting rates to remain competitive in the Fixed Rate Deferred and Fixed Indexed Annuity marketplace. Despite the current challenges facing many financial institutions, GCU continues to maintain a strong financial position. Our sincere thank you and appreciation for your continued support and trust in placing your life and annuity business with us!



Second Quarter 2024 Financials

As seasons change so do the ebbs and flows of our economic environment. In the past two years, we experienced record high inflation, sharp increases in interest rates, and volatile global tension. That said, the U.S. economy has been stubbornly resilient. We come to expect change as inevitable. It appears we are on the cusp of another change. Consensus opinion points to the Fed lowering interest rates as soon as September. For retirees and investors alike, it may be time to speak with your advisor and lock these higher rates with GCU. Our primary goal is to maintain financial strength in changing rate environments. Our members trust GCU to “do-the-right-thing,” knowing their investments in annuity and life products will remain safe and secure for the long term.

The financial results for the six months ended June 30, 2024, as compared to the prior period in 2023 are as follows:

GCU’s total assets increased \$46.7 million to \$2.75 billion and surplus decreased slightly to \$216.9 million as of June 30, 2024. Total adjusted capital increased to \$252.2 million at June 30, 2024.

Income (loss) before net realized capital gains (losses) totaled (\$1.7) million for the six months ended June 30, 2024 compared to \$3.1 million reported in 2023. The net gain from operations was lower in 2024 primarily due to

increased crediting rates on annuity products. Net income (loss) after realized capital gains (losses) was (\$1.2) million in 2024 compared to \$2.7 million in 2023. We had \$403 thousand in net realized gains in 2024.

Total Assets increased from year-end through reinvestment of investment earnings into bonds and alternative assets. The market value of derivative assets increased due to the growth in value of the indices underlying our fixed index annuities.

Liabilities totaling \$2.53 billion on June 30, 2024, increased relative to new life and annuity premiums, net of outflows for surrender activity. The \$51.1 million increase in total liabilities primarily represents a \$43.1 million increase in life and annuity reserves, a \$7.3 million increase in Asset Valuation Reserve (AVR), reduced by \$765 thousand change in the interest maintenance reserve (IMR).

Total Income was \$230.8 million in the first half of 2024, a decrease of \$13.7 million compared to \$244.5 million in 2023. Annuity premium and exchanges decreased \$14 million from the prior year. Net investment income increased \$1.1 million to \$59.8 million.

Operating expenses, before the change in reserves, totaled \$190.0 million versus \$192.0 million in 2023, a decrease of \$2.0 million. Annuity surrenders and death claims decreased \$9.4 million in 2024 to \$131.8 million in paid benefits. We were successful in limiting the growth in general expenses which were \$0.5 million lower in 2024 when compared to 2023.

The change in reserves totaled \$42.8 million in 2024 compared to \$49.2 million in 2023. Reserve changes are a function of premiums received, death claims, annuity

benefits paid and interest accumulation.

Surplus on June 30, 2024 decreased \$4.4 million to \$216.9 million versus \$221.3 million at year-end. The changes in surplus reflect the increase in unrealized gains offset by the net loss additional funding to the AVR.

Total Adjusted Capital (TAC), a risk metric used by regulators and rating agencies, increased \$2.9 million to \$252.2 million as of June 30, 2024, from \$249.4 million at December 31, 2023. TAC starts with surplus of \$216.9 million and

adds back the asset valuation reserve of \$35.2 million and one-half the dividend liability of \$155,000. The solvency ratios based on TAC was 110.1% on June 30, 2024 and 110.2% at December 31, 2023. GCU strives to maintain stability of financial strength in high interest rate environments.

This Little Light Of Mine I'm Gonna Let It Shine

Growing up we never went on a family vacation. Once school was over, you played at home, helped around the house, sometimes we did a road trip to visit family, friends and occasionally we would end up swimming at Hickory Run State Park. When I lived in the “old country-stary kraj,” we would play in the woods, swim in the river or ride our bikes to the Domaša Lake. These are the memories I have from my childhood.

There is one memory however that I share from both continents: catching fireflies in our back yard. This was always an evening activity that I enjoyed with my friends, and there are several lessons we can learn from enjoying this summer activity.

In Slovakia fireflies or lightening bugs are called “Svätojánske mušky” which basically means “St. John’s flies.” You might be asking why do they call them St. John’s flies? Keep in mind that back in the day, our faithful living in what we call the “old country-stary kraj,” lived out their faith on a daily basis. The day began and ended with the church bell ringing in the villages. The Divine Liturgy, Sacraments and Sacramentals-Blessings were celebrated. As part of observing the Liturgical year, the fields were blessed, honey, fruit, flowers/herbs were also blessed. This was the “ethos” of our people, keeping in mind “Bez Boha, ne do poroha - Without God, you can’t even get as far as the threshold.” So naming fireflies after a saint would almost be expected, since these amazing flying, light-producing insects emerge around the Nativity of St. John the Baptist celebrated on June 24th.

Fireflies are a hallmark of the summer and the twinkling flashes of light add a touch of magic to our evenings throughout the U.S. They LIGHT UP the darkness around us.

Friends, we need only read the news to see evidence that darkness has been increasing all around us. In Pittsburgh it seems like daily we witness domestic violence, gun violence and drug overdose deaths—political violence is increasing as well.

In the midst of all this and so much more, the world is in need of light. As we look into the history of the GCU it is quite evident that this organization provided so much “light” to our people facing hardships and trials in life. What about you and me in this 21st century. Can we be a LIGHT? The answer is absolutely.

In Matthew 5: 14-16 our Lord says: “You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lamp stand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.”

Based upon those verses our Lord gives us a solution to today’s world’s darkness: you and me, our families, our parish communities, our holy church and the GCU. You are called to choose to live a life full of light instead. By embracing light and breaking away from the darkness of this world we restore our joy, trust and ability to love in relationships. The light of Christ relieves anxiety and helps us be at peace.

Lessons in the Law

August is “National Make A Will Month”

I just finished reading my AARP Magazine and found out that August is “National Make a Will Month.” For me that triggered an idea for this article and for all of us to answer the following questions. I have read that less than 40% of adults have Wills in place.

Questions to consider:

- Do you have a Will?
- Do you know where the original Will is located?
- When was the last time you reviewed your Will?
- Do you have the correct beneficiaries named in the Will?
- Do you have the correct Executors named in the Will?
- Have your assets changed that could affect your Will?
- Have some of the beneficiaries named in the Will died?
- Did you properly provide for your minor children?
- If you are divorced, did you remove your ex-spouse from the Will?
- Have you reviewed your Will with any of your beneficiaries?

- Have you told your beneficiaries where the Will is located?
- Can your beneficiaries access the area where your Will is located?
- Do you want to name a charitable organization as a beneficiary?

As you can see, there are many questions that need to be answered and reviewed. There is a report that states that 50% of Wills are out-of-date and/or problematic.

I suggest to my clients that they review their Wills and estate planning documents every 5 years or when there is a life-changing event.

Even though August is “National Make a Will Month,” let’s add to that statement “... And the Month to Review and/or Update Your Will.” I have seen many Wills fail because they are out-of-date or just plain wrong. Many people try to write their own Wills and many people fail at this task. Please contact an attorney well versed in this area of the law.






